MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT: Health Sciences Occupational Therapy Program

BETWEEN

Allen College

and

Central Rivers AEA 1521 Technology Parkway, Cedar Falls, IA 50613

This is an Agreement made between Allen College (hereinafter called the COLLEGE) and Central Rivers AEA (hereinafter called the COOPERATING AGENCY).

I. PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

This is a mutual Agreement between the **COLLEGE** offering nursing and allied health programs and the **COOPERATING AGENCY** providing clinical areas for selected student learning. The basic purpose of this Agreement is to establish cooperative relationships and to outline the responsibilities of the two cooperating parties as they contribute to the learning of students.

II. AGREEMENT

A. The COLLEGE agrees:

- 1. To provide classroom instruction and to assume responsibility for the clinical instruction throughout the entire program.
- 2. To coordinate, through its designated representative(s), learning experiences for students after consultation with the **COOPERATING AGENCY**.
- To acknowledge that its students shall be expected to comply with all current policies and procedures of the COOPERATING AGENCY.
- 4. To submit the specific dates of the fieldwork experience to the **COOPERATING AGENCY** prior to its effective date with the following information included:
 - a. The number and name of student(s) and dates and hours they will be assigned for practical experience.
 - b. The clinical level of experience of each student and the expected level of experience to which such students will be assigned.
 - c. The learning objectives for the assigned student.
 - d. The verification of student malpractice coverage, cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, immunization status, blood borne pathogen precaution training, and HIPAA training.
 - e. Necessary changes to the submitted schedule shall be made by mutual agreement of the COLLEGE and the COOPERATING AGENCY as soon as possible prior to the time the altered schedule is to become effective.
- To provide for continuous planning with the COOPERATING AGENCY, indicating the learning experiences desired for students.
- 6. That the **COOPERATING AGENCY** may request the **COLLEGE** withdraw from the clinical area any student whose clinical practice, conduct, or health may have a detrimental effect on its patients or personnel; and/or reserve the right to not accept any student who has previously been discharged by said

COOPERATING AGENCY for reasons which would make acceptance as a clinical practice student inexpedient.

- 7. All students have signed a confidentiality statement regarding patient information. Faculty and students have received the educational component related to Health Information Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) required of health care providers and are held accountable by the college. The Protected Health Information (PHI) about a patient or client is the property of the COOPERATING AGENCY.
- 8. The **COLLEGE** conducts criminal background checks on all students and complies with Allen College Standard Operation Procedure 2-C-800-02.
- 9. Students shall be covered by the "Student Liability Insurance Plan". Limit of liability is \$1,000,000 for each claim and \$3,000,000 annual aggregate.
- 10. Upon admission to the specific program, all students complete a physical examination, 10-panel drug screen and a criminal background and abuse check. Each student shall have tuberculin tests and CPR verification prior to clinical placement. Each student shall have documentation of current immunizations as recommended by the Center for Disease Control including: influenza, MMR, varicella, TDAP. Hepatitis B is offered to students but may be declined.
- 11. Students shall follow the **COOPERATING AGENCY'S** policies regarding OSHA's Bloodborne pathogen and other infection control/isolation policies.

Exposures will be reported through the **COOPERATING AGENCY'S** expose report program, evaluation of the source's infection status will be the responsibility of the **COOPERATING AGENCY**. After the initial exposure evaluation, the student will be responsible for follow-up examinations and/or treatments. A copy of the exposure report form shall be sent to the **COLLEGE**.

The student shall be responsible for evaluation and follow-up examination/treatment for other injuries incurred while having the clinical experience as outlined in the student handbook under clinical policies and procedures.

Incidents shall be reported through the **COOPERATING AGENCY'S** risk management program. When an incident results in serious outcome to the patient, the **COOPERATING AGENCY'S** Risk Manager shall be notified by the faculty member. Allen's Health System (the **COLLEGE**) Risk Manager shall be advised of any legal activity related to the incident by the **COOPERATING AGENCY'S** risk manager.

- 12. Students have received the educational component related to OSHA'S STANDARD 29 CFR Part 1919.1030, "Occupational Exposure to Bloodborne Pathogens" and are certified in Basic Life Support for Health Care Providers.
- 13. Students shall be allowed to perform only those tasks commensurate with their level of education (as identified in the clinical objectives and course outlines)
- 14. That the COLLEGE shall hold harmless and indemnify the COOPERATING AGENCY from any and all claims, judgments or expenses arising from acts or omissions of their students. Said expenses shall include but not be limited to attorney fees, court costs and investigation expenses.

B. The COOPERATING AGENCY agrees:

- 1. To make fieldwork experiences available for student learning.
- That the schedule for students assigned in the fieldwork experience shall be determined by the COLLEGE'S faculty in consultation with the supervisor and/or administrator of the COOPERATING AGENCY.
- 3. That the faculty member(s) of the **COLLEGE** program shall be responsible for determining desired learning experiences and for the comprehensive evaluation of students.
- 4. That the COOPERATING AGENCY shall provide instruction and learning experiences under the supervision of qualified personnel who (a) meet the standards of recognized professional accrediting agencies or state regulatory agencies (b) are licensed and/or certified to practice in the respective allied health profession (c) support the philosophy and the stated objectives of the educational program.
- To be responsible for assigning clinical instructors for each student in accordance with professional standards.
- 6. To accept the enrolled students without discrimination as to race, color, creed, sex, marital status, age, national origin or qualified handicap.
- 7. To contribute toward promoting a positive atmosphere and one that is conducive to learning.
- 8. The **COOPERATING AGENCY** 's representative (direct student supervisor) will provide feedback on student performance by completing a structured evaluation tool provided by the **COLLEGE** 's program department to be used as a component of the student's progress in the program.
- 9. To observe the following student personnel policies:
 - a. Students shall be required to wear the adopted COLLEGE student uniform or dress appropriate to the assigned agency as determined by faculty and COOPERATING AGENCY personnel.
 - b. Students shall be responsible for providing and maintaining their own uniforms, including laundering.
 - c. Men and women students shall be permitted to use the rest rooms and dressing rooms.
 - d. Students may be permitted to eat in the dining facilities (if available) and purchase food at the regular rates. The COOPERATING AGENCY is not expected to provide meals for students.
 - e. The **COLLEGE** policy requires that the department or service of the **COOPERATING AGENCY** will be notified of student absences as early as possible prior to the scheduled fieldwork experience period.
 - f. Absences other than for illness shall be granted only by the clinical instructor(s) of the **COOPERATING AGENCY** with notification to the designated representative of the **COLLEGE'S** program.
 - g. The student shall be responsible for providing his/her own transportation.
- 10. COOPERATING AGENCY shall hold harmless and indemnify the COLLEGE from any and all claims, judgments or expenses arising from acts or omissions of COOPERATING AGENCY, its directors, officers, employees or agents. Said expenses shall include but not be limited to attorney fees, court costs and investigation expenses.
- 11. COOPERATING AGENCY shall maintain adequate insurance necessary to cover its indemnification obligations under this Agreement.

12. COOPERATING AGENCY will make available emergency care for students in the event of illness or accident, while at COOPERATING AGENCY, in accordance with COOPERATING AGENCY'S policies. In the event COOPERATING AGENCY has no facilities or staff available for, or capable of, the provision of emergency medical treatment, should a student require emergency medical treatment, the student shall be responsible for obtaining their own care, however, COOPERATING AGENCY shall assist the student in their attempts to obtain care. Any cost for emergency care shall be the responsibility of the student.

C. The COLLEGE and the COOPERATING AGENCY agree:

- 1. That the COOPERATING AGENCY retains responsibility for all patient/client care and their PHI.
- 2. To review this Agreement every three years or as needed.
- 3. Non-assignment of students to **COOPERATING AGENCY** for any given fieldwork experience shall not affect the continuation of this Agreement.
- 4. The **COLLEGE** shall provide a faculty member(s) who will serve as liaison with the **COOPERATING AGENCY** representative when necessary.
- 5. The **COLLEGE** shall provide and maintain the records and reports necessary for conducting clinical learning experiences of its students under this Agreement.
- 6. That if either party wishes to withdraw from this Agreement, the party shall give at least 60 days' notice prior to action. The students enrolled in several clinical services shall be given an opportunity to complete the full program in those services.

This agreement shall remain effective for a indefinitely or at such time as it becomes necessary for either party to revise or terminate. This agreement replaces all other agreements already in place between the **COOPERATING AGENCY** and **COLLEGE**. This agreement becomes effective on October 1, 2018.

To support a timely staff replacement selection process and assist in budget planning, I recommend an incentive be provided for Certified, NUSS, and Administrative Staff who provide early notification of their intent to resign or retire at the end of the 2018-19 work year.

Accumulated Benefits

All full-time employees shall be entitled to fifteen (15) sick leave days for each working year as of the first official day of said school year whether or not they report for duty that day. Unused sick leave days shall be accumulated from year to year with a maximum accumulation of one hundred fifty (150) days.

Sick leave days shall be allotted proportionally for all regular part-time employees. Employees working less than 1.0 FTE, based on hire date, shall receive days in proportion to their FTE.

Planned leaves should be submitted at least two (2) working days in advance, except in cases of emergency.

Long-term Illness

An employee new to the Agency may have additional paid sick leave days in addition to the regular sick leave allotment, when the employee has a serious illness, injury, or disability. Such serious illness, injury, or disability is defined as that requiring continuing treatment by a licensed physician for a period exceeding six (6) consecutive school days, one or more of which exceeds the regular sick leave allotment. These long-term illness days are noncumulative. Application for the additional days for long-term illness may be filed with the Human Resources Office when the need arises.

An employee having accumulated one hundred fifty (150) days and utilizing all one hundred fifty (150) days for a serious illness, injury, or disability and returning to active employment status may have additional paid sick leave days in addition to the regular sick leave allotment when the employee has another serious illness, injury or disability. Such serious illness, injury, or disability is defined as that requiring continuing treatment by a licensed physician for a period exceeding six (6) consecutive school days, one or more of which exceeds the regular sick leave allotment. These long-term illness days are noncumulative. Application for the additional days for long-term illness may be filed with the Human Resources Office when the need arises.

Long-term illness Days Schedule

First year – Thirty (30) Work Days Continuous Illness Second year – Twenty (20) Work Days Continuous Illness Third year – Ten (10) Work Days Continuous Illness

Use of Sick Leave for Child, Parent or Spouse or Domestic Partner Illness

Up to **seven** five days of your own sick leave may be used by the employee to care for a sick child/step-child, parent/step-parent, or spouse, or domestic partner.

Medical Emergency Leave (deducted from your sick leave bank)

- a. In the event of any one of the following occurrences, medical emergency leave is available as stipulated in paragraph b., below. A request for medical emergency leave must be submitted and include a written statement explaining their need for this leave based on the occurrences below. If necessary, prior to final approval, the Human Resources office may request additional information from employees or other sources (such as health/medical personnel) verifying the need for this leave. The occurrences are:
 - (1) An emergency situation requiring medical attention.

 Emergency is defined as: an unforeseen combination of circumstances or the resulting state that calls for immediate action.
 - (2) Any surgical procedure requiring general anesthetic, as needed, up to one (1) day.
 - (3) Critical illness (life threatening) situation.
- b. A leave of absence of up to five (5) contract days per contract year may be granted in case of a medical emergency of a member of the immediate family (employee's spouse, child, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, parent, mother-in-law, father-in-law, brother, sister, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, grandparents, grandchildren, including equivalent step family members, and any other member of the immediate household), and an additional five (5) contract days per contract year may be granted by the Human Resources Director. Not subject to grievance.
- c. Days used for medical emergency will be deducted from your sick leave bank.

Notification of Accumulation

Employees shall be given a copy of a written accounting of accumulated sick leave upon request.

Medical Leave for Doctor's Appointments

Medical appointments which are made during the regularly contracted or defined work day can be taken in fifteen minute increments.

Medical Leave

Sick leave usage in excess of six (6) successive days shall require medical documentation of the physical or mental disability necessitating such leave. The leave form shall designate the day the leave was to begin as well as an actual or projected date of return to work. If the employee is unable to return to work on the day designated, further medical documentation shall be required.

Leave forms shall be available in the Human Resources Office and should be returned there with the doctor's signature.

Bereavement Leave

Up to five (5) days of leave shall be granted at any one time in the event of death of an employee's spouse, child, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, parent, mother-in-law, father-in-law, brother, sister, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, grandparents, grandchildren, niece, nephew, including equivalent step family members, and any other member of the immediate household. Under extenuating circumstances, an additional five (5) days may be granted by the Administrator, not subject to grievance.

Employees shall be granted sufficient time to attend the funeral services not exceeding one (1) day in the event of death of a friend or relative outside the employee's immediate family as defined in the paragraph above. Additional time may be granted depending on circumstances.
