HARASSMENT AND BULLYING

Law and Definition

lowa Code section 280.28, defines harassment and bullying as: "Any electronic, written, verbal, or physical act or conduct toward a student which is based on any actual or perceived trait or characteristic of the student and which creates an objectively hostile school environment that meets one or more of the following conditions:

- 1. Places the student in reasonable fear of harm to the student's person or property.
- 2. Has a substantially detrimental effect on the student's physical or mental health.
- 3. Has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's academic performance.
- 4. Has the effect of substantially interfering with the student's ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or privileges provided by a school."

"Trait or characteristic of the student" includes but is not limited to age, color, creed, national origin, race, religion, marital status, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, physical attributes, physical or mental ability or disability, ancestry, political party preference, political belief, socioeconomic status, or familial status

Tips:

- A formal written complaint is not needed to investigate a potential harassment or bullying situation. As soon as
 a school hears about a bullying and harassment incident it should be investigated. Schools should follow their
 bullying and harassment board policy when investigating.
- Never have the bully and the individual being bullied sit down together to discuss the issue.
- Review the district bullying and harassment definition, policy and procedures with students, staff and parents each year.

EARLY LITERACY BLUEPRINT INITIATIVE

The Iowa Reading Research Center is partnering with the Iowa Department of Education for the new Early Literacy Blueprint Initiative focused on implementing effective literacy instructional practices among teachers that will positively affect student literacy proficiency.

So far, there are over 30 Certified Blueprint Trainers prepared by a training-of-trainers approach to deliver to teachers six professional development modules. Contact your local Area Education Agency for more information on any potential upcoming professional development sessions on Blueprint modules.

Another component of the Blueprint is the <u>High-Priority Milestones for K-3 Reading Development</u> document. The milestones explain which literacy skills students need to master by the end of each grade, providing a starting point for evaluating literacy plans to make sure students are progressing on schedule. Overall recommendations for student motivation and engagement, maintaining a supportive and data-driven literacy environment, and supporting English learners and bilingual students are also included.

STANDARDS AND CURRICULUM UPDATES

Over the summer, the bureau chief from Educator Quality left the Department and the bureau was dissolved. Therefore, the Bureau of Standards and Curriculum welcomes many new colleagues from Educator Quality: Mary Breyfogle, Larry Bice, Matt Ludwig, Carole Richardson and Marietta Rives. The purpose and mission and work of the **Leading, Teaching, Learning Services Bureau now** will fuse the work of Educator Quality and Standards and Curriculum.

Biliteracy Seal: A new law passed last session to offer the biliteracy seal to districts to honor students who graduate from high school literate in 2 or more languages, one being English. Guidance will be coming out in September for districts to implement this award. We hope to have 100% of lowa districts implement this honor.

Computer Science Incentive Fund: Thank you for working very hard over the summer to submit an application for the Computer Science Professional Development Incentive Fund. A million dollars will help support expanding the reach and rigor of computer science instruction in 49 Iowa school districts. Recipients represent rural, suburban, urban districts from all areas of the state.

Fine Arts Modules: On September 24, professional learning around lowa's new voluntary Fine Arts Standards will be available on AEA Learning Online. Five self-paced modules will be released: Introducing lowa's Fine Arts Standards, Understanding lowa's Fine Arts Standards, Applying and Connecting lowa's Fine Arts Standards, Assessing lowa's Fine Arts Standards, and Resources for Implementation. These modules can be taken individually, depending on district's and educator's needs, or bundled together for license renewal credit.

Leadership Teams: The Department of Education convenes leadership teams each year to support the disciplines of the lowa Academic Standards and student populations. Thank you for championing these important groups to continue the great work to support the implementation of the standards for all lowa students. Your dynamic teachers, teacher leaders, and administrators are key stakeholders to their success.

Mathematics: Find resources that are best practice and supported by research: Standards (<u>Focus</u>, <u>Coherence</u>, <u>Rigor</u>), Instruction (<u>Aligned Instruction</u>, <u>Instructional Practice Guide</u>), and Resources (<u>Aligned Resources</u>. <u>IMET</u>, <u>Equip</u>).

Physical Education/Health Standards Review: The Department is excited to convene the Physical Education and Health Standards Review Team in September to review and recommend standards for adoption. We anticipate recommending new voluntary standards to the State Board next spring.

Social Studies: The Department is supporting workshops through the AEAs to support implementation of lowa's new social studies standards. Each AEA is offering several two-day elementary and secondary <u>workshops</u> focused on year two implementation of the standards.
