What is it?

The PREPaRE curriculum has been developed by the National Association of School Psychologists (NASP) as part of NASP's decade-long leadership in providing evidence-based resources and consultation related to school crisis prevention and response. PREPaRE training is ideal for schools committed to improving and strengthening their school safety and crisis management plans and emergency response.

There are two workshops associated with this training:

PREPaRE Workshop 1, Second Edition

This 1-day workshop provides school-based mental health professionals, administrators, security professionals, and educators the knowledge and resources to help them establish and sustain comprehensive school safety and crisis prevention and preparedness efforts. At this time, it will not be offered for our LEA partners as we want districts to complete the State recommended training.

PREPaRE Workshop 2, Second Edition

This 2-day workshop provides school-based mental health professionals and other school crisis intervention team members with the knowledge and resources to meet the mental health needs of students and staff following a school-associated crisis event.

Workshop 2 is for school-based mental health professionals, including guidance counselors, school social workers, school psychologists, and other school crisis intervention team members.

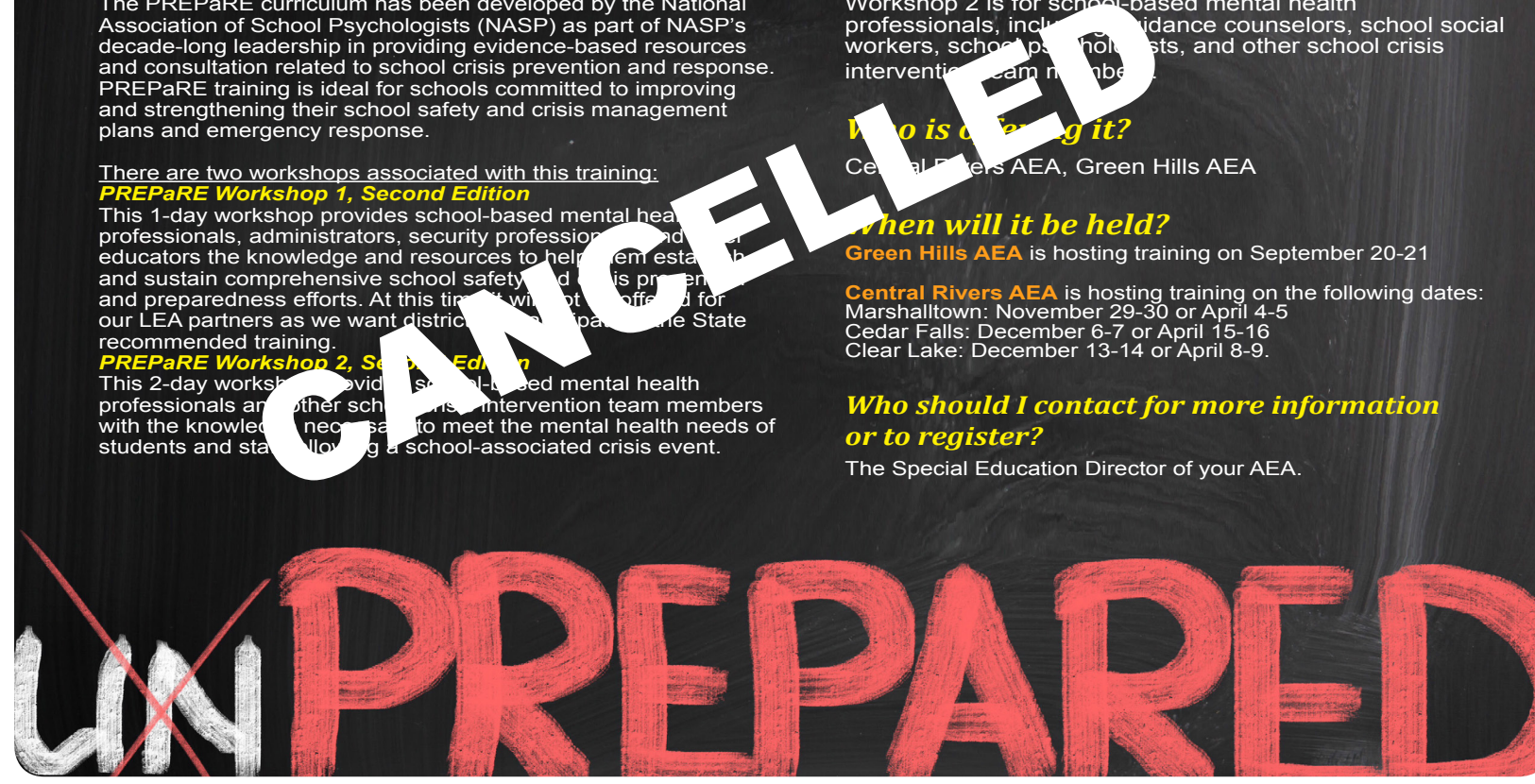

Online training module for SUICIDE PREVENTION

What is it?

As part of legislation passed during the 2018 session, schools will be required to ensure annual training, one hour in length, of their staff on suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention. **These requirements become effective July 1, 2019.** Iowa's Area Education Agencies are developing a common online training module that will align with and meet the requirements of SF 2113. This module will be available on Oct. 1. In the meantime, schools may use the national, online module at <http://sptsuniversity.org/>. This is a quality training that covers prevention, intervention, and postvention, and is two hours in length.

Who should attend?

Personnel who have regular interaction with students in grades kindergarten through 12, which applies to all school personnel who hold a license, certificate, authorization, or statement of professional recognition.
