# **DROPOUT REPORT**

# Certification Deadline: December 14th

The Dropout Report is for all public districts and non-public buildings housing grades 7-12 who report via SRI. The Dropout Report is found in the portal (EdInfo > Student Level Applications > Dropout Report). This report shows students who are considered dropouts between the dates of 10/1/2017 and 9/30/2018. Contact an SRI consultant if you need to add a student, or if a student needs to be removed from the report.

### WINTER STUDENT REPORTING IN IOWA (SRI)

The main focus of Winter SRI is curriculum (e.g., Offer and Teach units and CTE courses). The test sites are available the month of December for data to be uploaded into VRF and submitted to SRI. The SRI site will be down on January 3<sup>rd</sup> - January 6<sup>th</sup>. The production site will open on January 7<sup>th</sup> for the Winter submission with a certification deadline of January 31<sup>st</sup>. Districts/nonpublics are STRONGLY encouraged to use the test site. If you are new to uploading files into VRF for state reporting or need a refresher, click here to access a recorded webcast. Districts/non-publics housing grades 9-12 must verify the Curriculum Accreditation Report which is found on the Home page in Winter SRI prior to certifying.
