Iowa Learning Online (ILO) to End Services After the 2019-2020 School Year

<u>lowa Learning Online</u> (ILO), the lowa Department of Education's initiative to expand high-quality online learning opportunities, will be available through spring semester of the 2019-20 school year. After that, districts will either need to create their own online classes or work with an approved private provider. ILO will no longer be able to provide courses after the 2019-20 school year because there is no long-term, sustainable funding source for operating the program.

Enrollment for <u>Fall</u> and <u>Spring</u> ILO courses is under way now. Also, we will be happy to work with your district regarding options for your transition to use of Department of Education-approved private providers of online courses or to your own district-developed online courses.

Harassment and Bullying

Law and Definition

Iowa Code section 280.28, defines harassment and bullying as: "Any electronic, written, verbal, or physical act or conduct toward a student which is based on any actual or perceived trait or characteristic of the student and which creates an objectively hostile school environment that meets one or more of the following conditions:

- 1. Places the student in reasonable fear of harm to the student's person or property.
- 2. Has a substantially detrimental effect on the student's physical or mental health.
- Has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's academic performance.

4. Has the effect of substantially interfering with the student's ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or privileges provided by a school."

"Trait or characteristic of the student" includes but is not limited to age, color, creed, national origin, race, religion, marital status, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, physical attributes, physical or mental ability or disability, ancestry, political party preference, political belief, socioeconomic status, or familial status

Tips:

- A formal written complaint is not needed to investigate a potential harassment or bullying situation. As soon as a school hears about a bullying and harassment incident it should be investigated. Schools should follow their bullying and harassment board policy when investigating.
- Never have the bully and the individual being bullied sit down together to discuss the issue.
- Review the district bullying and harassment definition, policy and procedures with students, staff and parents each year.

Before and After School Programs:

<u>lowa 21st Century Community Learning</u> (TITLE IV B) Grants Application for Cohort 15 will be updated by the first week of September. Over \$6,780,000 will be awarded in this grant competition. We will have three technical assistance meetings and one virtual meeting to assist applicants with questions about applying for this federal program. The locations and dates will be posted on the 21st Century page of the IDOE website. This is a competitive application to provide afterschool and summer school programs for at-risk children. A minimum of 40% of students receiving free or reduced lunch is required to apply. In the last competition (Cohort 14), 11 awards were made to fund 25 sites serving 1,555 children with an average of 69% free and reduced lunch. A summary of the program is <u>available</u> on the IDOE website.

Mathematics:

There are many instructional resources and professional learning opportunities in mathematics. The <u>Principles to Actions Toolkit</u> has resources focused on Effective Teaching Practices and Guiding Principles for mathematics from the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics (NCTM). These help all students

become mathematical thinkers and prepared for any career or profession. Register for the 2019 ICTM Annual Mathematics Conference on October 14, 2019 in West Des Moines. There will be opportunities for teachers to learn more about number sense, *Principles to Actions*, Desmos, mathematical discourse, and access and equity. There are also several opportunities for application on the 2019-2020 Scale-Up Mathematics Application from the Governor's STEM Advisory Council. Please peruse them and consider submitting an application.

Science

There are a lot of great opportunities for educators to keep moving toward implementing our lowa Science Standards with fidelity. The MINK Collaborative is professional learning and networking with educators in Missouri, Nebraska, and Kansas. The focus of this year's online meetings will be "Using Formative Assessments to Improve Science Learning." The Iowa Science Coaching Network are webinars led by instructional coaches from Southeast Polk CSD. The webinars serve as a platform for coaches to learn about the science standards and best practices, share resources used to coach teachers and provide PD to teachers, and reflect on coaching strategies through coaching conversations and by posing questions to other coaches.

Social Studies: Constitution Day
