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SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EQUITY IN EDUCATION PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SERIES

A Call for Proposals: The lowa Department of Education (Department) is looking for experts to help launch a new professional development series focusing on social justice and equity in education issues. The Department will host a series of bi-monthly* webinars that focus exclusively on social inequities and the impact on the educational experience for students. These sessions will be delivered by local and national leaders with a proven background in diversity, multiculturalism, and racial consciousness.

The purpose of the webinar series is to provide participants with ideas that can be implemented during classroom instruction and will consist of a self-study component, various resources to access and design ideas to use. Resources will reflect current research that is viewed through an equity lens with a focus on systemic societal barriers to student success.

The following objectives outline expectations for the webinar series:

- Develop professional learning communities based on proven strategies to eliminate achievement gaps and disproportionality in special education.
- Examine and discuss root causes and racial and ethnic disparities in education, school discipline, and juvenile justice systems.
- Identify and support research-based initiatives on culturally responsive and inclusive pedagogy representing all learner backgrounds.
- Implement an equity audit process to assess the degree of equity or inequity present in schools and colleges. Increase the capacity of educators to identify and address completion and persistence rates for underrepresented students in graduation and workforce goals.
- Increase the knowledge and skills of stakeholders in equity and civil rights mandates.
- Provide ongoing training to ensure that all staff are knowledgeable on required compliance surrounding federal and state civil rights laws.
