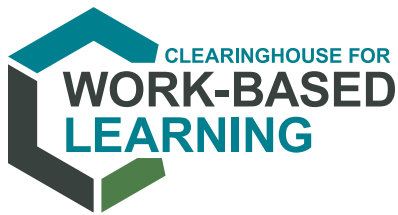


# Build Iowa's Future Design Challenge

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This work-based learning challenge offers students an opportunity to use their ingenuity to design a model home (K-5 and 6-8) or to dream about a project that could benefit their community (9-12). Math, science and English/language arts are among the state academic standards the challenge covers. Students also will connect their projects to high-demand careers across Iowa. Project awards – up to \$1,000 for first prize in each of three grade bands – can be used for school work-based learning activities.

The [Build Iowa's Future Design Challenge](#) is open to teachers and students in school districts and accredited nonpublic schools who sign up to participate through the Clearinghouse. Elementary and middle school students will participate in the Iowa Home Design Challenge by constructing a model home using materials such as toy plastic construction bricks, wood blocks or a variety of other materials of their choice. High school students will participate in the Iowa Dream and Design Challenge, which involves conceptualizing and designing but not constructing the actual project.
