Free Appropriate Public Education

Central Rivers AEA shall provide a free appropriate public education (FAPE) for all resident individuals with disabilities from birth to age 21, or to the maximum age allowable in accordance with the law. A free appropriate public education is defined to include general and special education and related services which:

- are provided at public expense, under public supervision and direction, and without charge to the parent.
- meet the standards of the State Education Agency pertaining to the education of students with disabilities.
- include early childhood, elementary, and secondary education.
- are provided in conformity with the Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP).
- include individuals requiring special education who have been suspended or expelled from school.
